## New Garden Plants.

PESCATOREA DAYANA, *n. sp.*

Sepalis oblongo-obovatis obtuse acutis; tepalis rhombico rotundatis; labello bene unguiculato basi utrinque angulato lamina oblonga retusa emarginata utrinque revoluta; disco toto labelli anteposito lævi; columna basi utrinque angulata; apiculo in ima basi, pilis paucis supra bassin.—*Zygopetalum Dayanum*.

A very curious novelty. The flower is like that of the old *Pescatorea cerina*. It is milk-white, with green tips to the sepals. The lip is white, with the callous ring beautifully purplish violet, while the base and the rays before the callosity are of the same colour. The column is beautifully yellow, with a broad reddish band over its base. The anther, too, is depressed, and brownish purplish. *Pescatorea cerina* differs in the projecting angles of its callous ring, bearing sinuses between them, and in the numerous warts over the whole blade of the lip, not to speak of the totally different colour. It has just flowered (end of November) in the celebrated Dayan collection, and is dedicated to my excellent correspondent. I have a strong suspicion that it comes from New Grenada, I having just the same flowers in spirits gathered by Mr. Wallis in that country. *H. G. Rehb. f.*
